**THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD  
 PENSAMIENTOS DE PADRE RICARDO**

■ **THE CONCORD DEANERY MORPHS**

Recently, The Concord Deanery expanded to include the Parish of Christ the King in Pleasant Hill and the Parish of St. Catherine's in Martinez, since we share a large part of Central Contra Costa County. At our last deanery meeting, we named ourselves the Todos Santos Deanery, taking the name of the original town now called Concord. Todos Santos was the original name given by Fernando Pacheco, the original land grantee of the area. 'Todos Santos' means 'All Saints': thus the name of the first Catholic Church, Queen of All Saints, and the name of the Concord Plaza, Todos Santos.

Fr. Ismael Gutierrez, Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi, is the new Dean, as I have served in that capacity for almost 20 years.

■ **ADVOCACY IN THE TODOS SANTOS DEANERY**

As a Deanery, we learn and share about our parish pastoral lives. Sometimes we have speakers to inform us of new diocesan resources. Clergy help each other with Penance services. Various pastoral staff members work together, sometimes sharing resources. It is important to know what each parish is doing and how we can support one another.

At our last Deanery meeting in March, meeting at Christ the King parish in Pleasant Hill, we decided to take on an advocacy role in the larger community, raising awareness and asking questions about larger, important issues so that the larger community can become aware of implications and consequences of decisions made by various government jurisdictions, thus promoting a more human, caring and altruistic spirit in our society.

I have been asked by the pastors and pastoral staff to speak on April 5th at the Concord City Council meeting to be held at the Concord Senior Center. The council hopes to decide which developer will be awarded the contract to build the first phase of the Reuse Plan for the

closed Concord Naval Weapons Station. Various other coalitions and groups will be speaking as well.

The development of the over 5,000 acres will be the most important development of a multi-use space in northern California for many years to come. Over 12,000 homes or living units will be built, along with commercial and educational facilities, open space and parks.

The City of Concord is to be congratulated for bringing the project to this point. It has taken ten years of consistent work, involving community participation, many conversations and input from many community groups, along with the Community Planning group, to bring the project to this point.

As Catholic clergy and lay pastoral ministers, our focus is to review the project from the point of view of just and living wages for those building the project, the amount of affordable housing, the definition of affordable housing, jobs for local residents of central county, and the impact on transportation.

This is a legacy project which needs to promote the best effect on the area's quality of life, be open to a wide spectrum of people with age, educational, economic and cultural diversity, and not become an enclave for a particular grouping. Catholic social justice principles should flavor the discussion, broaden the perspective and promote a mini- universe where a universe of interests sustains a universe of needs.

As the project comes online, our group will advocate for a project contract that will promote, clarify and include concrete decisions and goals that incorporate social justice values that I mentioned above. This project is good and we want it to be better. The worker does not exist for the economy; but rather, the economy exists for the worker. What will be good for all the people is what is most important. The City should want to create a win-win situation for everyone.

It was not that long ago that in 1943 the United States government confiscated the property and homes of over 100 long-time Concord families for \$175 per acre, now the 5,000 plus acres for reuse. Let us

not cause any undue hardship on anyone again. The more inclusive the project can be of all the interests of the people of Concord, the better the completed project will be.

Parishioners Ed Shockley and Mary Agnes Hardie (now deceased) and her husband, Dan Hardie were active participants in the early conversations about the Reuse Project. I invite all parishioners interested in the Reuse Project and promoting inclusion of diversity and opening up of future possibilities of prosperity for all to come to the **City Council Meeting on April 5, 2016 at 6:30pm at the Concord Senior Center.**

**■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY –  
April 3, 2016, Second Sunday of  
Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy**



Last year on this Sunday, Pope Francis declared this year a *Jubilee Year of Mercy*. Saint John Paul II named the Second Sunday of Easter "Sunday of Divine Mercy" in response

to Saint Faustina Kowalska's Divine Mercy devotion, which offered spiritual comfort to hearts worldwide. But Francis challenges us to make that comfort we receive a gift we gladly share: "We are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us." The clearest expression of merciful love, says Francis, is pardoning others. "At times how hard it seems to forgive!" he acknowledges. "And yet pardon is the instrument placed into our fragile hands to attain serenity of heart" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 9). The necessary condition for living joyfully? "To let go of anger, wrath, violence, and revenge." May Divine Mercy Sunday in this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* remind us that Jesus made mercy our life's ideal and a criterion for our faith's credibility: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Matthew 5:7).

## ■ JUAN 20: 19-31

En los días de esplendor de la Resurrección de Jesús, el número de mujeres y hombres que creían en el Señor iba en aumento y los apóstoles también estaban colaborando a este crecimiento de fe al Señor, ya que ellos habían iniciado su misión de ser testigos y anunciar a todas las naciones que Cristo era el Mesías y que había resucitado, habiendo recibido del resucitado poder para sanar a los enfermos y realizar obras milagrosas en su nombre.

Los apóstoles realizaron muchos signos y prodigios que hicieron reaccionar a la gente; a los judíos y a los gentiles a cambiar de modo de vivir, a convertirse en portadores del anuncio de la salvación, a vivir la resurrección de Cristo. Pablo, que se incorpora después para seguir a Cristo, junto con Pedro, anuncian el Kerigma: “Dios ha resucitado a Jesús” “a quien vosotros crucificasteis y ejecutasteis”, para que a través de él se conceda a Israel y al pueblo de hoy, el arrepentimiento y el perdón de los pecadores. “Nosotros y el Espíritu Santo somos testigos de todo esto.”

Estas afirmaciones y respuestas del trabajo de los apóstoles enfureció a las autoridades, que querían matar a los apóstoles, pero un fariseo notable (Gamaliel) gran teólogo y maestro de Pablo, persuade al Sanedrín de que espere a ver si este movimiento es de origen humano sin más, en cuyo caso fracasará como otros muchos del pasado, o si tiene su origen en Dios, en cuyo caso las autoridades y el propio Sanedrín estarían luchando contra Dios. El Sanedrín tuvo miedo y solo los dio a azotar y fueron puestos en libertad siendo advertidos, pero los apóstoles se retiran felices y contentos de haber tenido el honor de sufrir humillaciones a causa de aquel hombre que había resucitado Dios.

El Evangelio de Juan, hoy nos narra la aparición de Jesús, ya resucitado, a sus discípulos. Jesús cumplió lo que les había prometido: un poco después de su partida lo volverían a ver y sus corazones se regocijarían. Les da “su paz”, “su libertad”, elimina el miedo y les da total bienestar del cuerpo y el alma, aquella paz que el mundo no puede dar.

En segundo lugar, Jesús también les otorga el Espíritu que les había prometido, como don de su breve partida, don necesario para que ellos pudieran anunciar la misión y ser testigos de su resurrección, los envía al mundo al igual que fue enviado él por su Padre para quitar los pecados del mundo y traer la comunión.

Esta verdad no necesita mucha explicación. El Padre nos invita a perdonarnos unos a otros sin límite y a permanecer así en comunión, lo mismo que Jesús nos perdona y nos pone en comunicación con el Padre. Dios les ayude. Diácono Mariano Preza.
