Christopher Scalia speak on Nov. 8th

The St. Thomas More Society of the Diocese of Wilmington is pleased to welcome Christopher Scalia as speaker for the Fall Lecture. He is the eighth of Justice Scalia's nine children and a former professor of English. Christopher Scalia recently co-edited *Scalia Speaks: Reflections on Law, Faith, and Life Well Lived* with Ed Whelan. The New Times bestselling book is a collection of speeches that his father, Justice Scalia, gave over a 30-year period.
