LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

What a weekend! Although we did not get the high winds near the center, we received the largest amount of rainfall in 1000 years from Hurricane Harvey. (But really, how do they know that?) Here at St. Jerome church, we had only 30.25 inches of rain, thanks to the accuracy of Alvin Hollas's electronic gauge. St. Jerome also had no damage from rising water in any of our buildings or new construction- just a few roof leaks. Thank God, the concrete was poured for the new parking lot on last Wednesday before the storm. Because of flooded streets, we had only two Masses last weekend, Saturday evening and 10 am Sunday with only a few people attending. That means St. Jerome missed almost a whole Sunday's collections. I hope that our generous parishioners will make up last week's Sunday offering this weekend or next, as we really need it for operating expenses. On top of all this I had been out of the country all lastly week, and we were able to land on the last flight at Bush airport before it closed noon Saturday, Aug. 26.

Now we have three weekends before our Fall Festival. Please help us make it a great success by selling as many raffle tickets as possible, and to give many the chance to win a new Nissan or one of the other nice prizes. Confirmations scheduled for today has been moved to October so that the families can return to some measure of normalcy.

As for the readings today about the cross, the first centuries of Christians witnessed many crucifixions. They were so horrified by it that the crucifixes we now routinely hang in homes, schools, parishes, and other institutions didn't start to appear until the sixth century. Crucifixion was capital punishment in Rome. "Crucifixion was most frequently used to punish political or religious agitators, pirates, slaves, or those who had no civil rights" It was cruel and public so that those who saw it knew, "this could happen to you if you defied the system." Christ's crucifixion was what eventually ended it as a form of capital punishment in the Roman empire. Constantine, out of veneration for Christ, abolished it in the early fourth century A.D. For early Christians, it was symbolized by a lamb, and then, when crucifixion was first abolished, by a jeweled cross. Crucifixes were made and spread to combat a heresy that denied that Christ was human and said he was divine and invulnerable on the Cross. The crucifix shows the suffering he humanly endured, a path to eternal life that it shows us even today.

CARTA DE NUESTRO PÁRROCO

Queridos Parroquianos,

¡Que fin de semana! Aunque no sentimos los fuertes vientos cerca del centro, hemos recibido la mayor cantidad de lluvia en 1000 años de huracán Harvey. (Pero realmente, ¿cómo saber?) Aquí la iglesia de San Jerónimo tenía sólo 30,25 pulgadas de lluvia, gracias a la precisión electrónica del calibrador de Alvin Holla's. San Jerónimo tampoco tuvo daños por aumento de agua en ninguno de nuestros edificios o nueva construcción - sólo unas goteras en el techo. Gracias a Dios, el concreto fue vertido para el nuevo estacionamiento el pasado miércoles antes de la tormenta. Por las calles inundadas, tuvimos sólo dos misas este fin de semana, el sábado por la tarde y 10:00 el domingo con sólo unos pocos asistentes. Eso significa que San Jerónimo le hizo faltado la colecta de casi todo del domingo. Espero que nuestros generosos feligreses den lo del domingo de la semana pasada y lo ofrezcan este fin de semana o el próximo, ya que lo necesitamos para gastos de funcionamiento. Además de todo esto había estado fuera del país toda la semana, y pudimos aterrizar en el último vuelo en el aeropuerto Bush antes de su cierre a mediodía el sábado, 26 de agosto.

Ahora tenemos tres fines de semana antes de nuestro Festival del otoño. Por favor ayúdenos a hacer un gran éxito vendiendo muchos boletos como sea posible y muchos tendrán la oportunidad de ganar un Nissan nuevo o uno de los otros premios agradables. La confirmación programada para hoy ha sido pospuesta Para octubre para que las familias puedan volver a cierta medida de la normalidad.

En cuanto a las lecturas de hoy sobre la Cruz, los primeros siglos los cristianos fueron testigo de muchas crucifixiones. Estaban tan horrorizados por las crucifixiones ahora habitualmente colgamos en casas, escuelas, parroquias y otras instituciones no empiezan a aparecer hasta el siglo VI. Crucifixión era la pena capital en Roma. "Crucifixión fue utilizada más frecuentemente para castigar a agitadores políticos o religiosos, piratas, esclavos o los que no tenían los derechos civiles" era cruel y público para que los que vieron lo sabían, "esto podría suceder a usted si usted desafía el sistema." Crucifixión de Cristo fue lo que terminó como una forma de pena capital en el imperio romano. Constantino, la veneración de Cristo, abolido en el temprano cuarto siglo A.D. Para los primeros cristianos, era simbolizado por un cordero, y luego, cuando primero fue suprimida la crucifixión, Los crucifijos fueron hechos y difundidos para combatir una herejía que negaba que Cristo era humano y dicho que él era divino e invulnerable en la Cruz. El crucifijo muestra el sufrimiento que soportó humanamente, un camino hacia la vida eterna que nos muestra aún hoy.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM – For children to be baptized at St. Jerome, parents must first call the parish office to register for baptism classes, held monthly in English and Spanish. Baptisms are held on the 1st and 2nd Wednesday of the month for Spanish and the 1st Wednesday of the month for English. *Parents of children to be baptized must be registered parishioners.*

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE – *To prepare for your wedding, at least six months prior to the planned wedding date, you should make an appointment with a priest or a deacon. At least one of the couple must be a registered parishioner. No dates will be confirmed over the telephone.*


