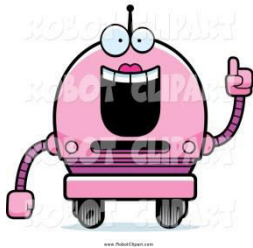

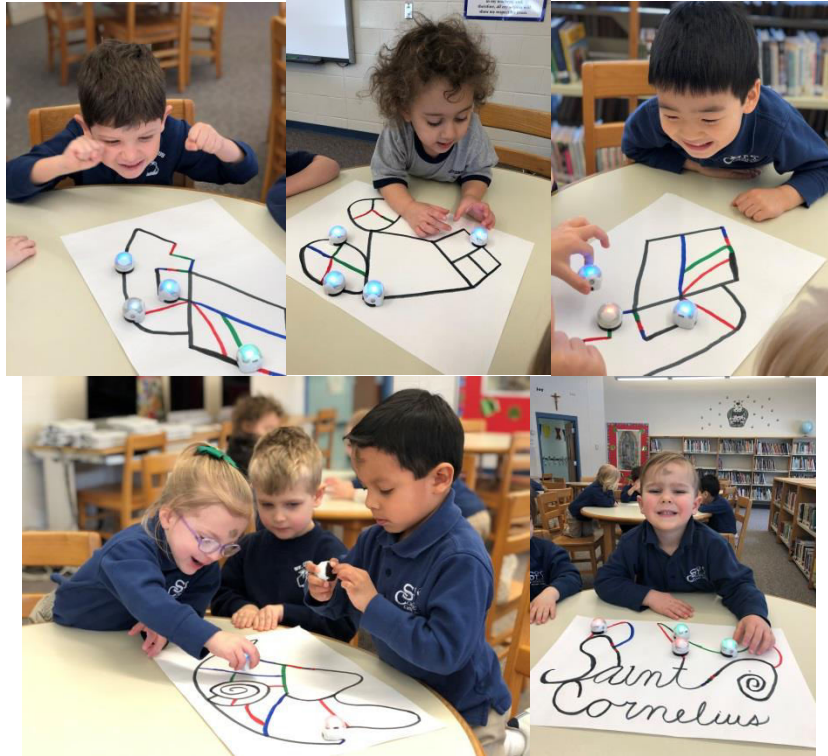

Thursday March 14th, Saint Cornelius School will sponsor a “dress down day” in support of the JDRF and one of our students, Mairead Reilly. Please read about her challenge from her mother’s perspective and hopefully all of our families will support this effort. Students and teachers may dress down if a donation is brought in to support this effort.

Mairead is a 3rd grader here at St. Cornelius. Many of you may recognize her as the bubbly little redhead who always has a smile on her face. What you may not know is that she fights a life threatening battle every day. Mairead is a type one diabetic, an autoimmune disease with no cure. She wears a pump 24/7 that injects insulin into her body to stay alive and has to closely monitor her blood glucose levels with multiple needle pricks a day. Everything affects blood glucose numbers from food to emotion to illness.

On March 14th, your children are being offered a dress down day for a donation to JDRF (Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation). Your donation will go to a very special part of JDRF called "Fund A Cure." This is a direct donation to fund the most critical diabetes research and specifically a cure for this autoimmune disease. We hope you will

join in this movement that offers hope, belief and support to not only Mairead, but the millions of adults and children who live with type 1 diabetes.

In addition, the Irish Dancers will perform for our school that afternoon around 2:15 in Walker Hall.

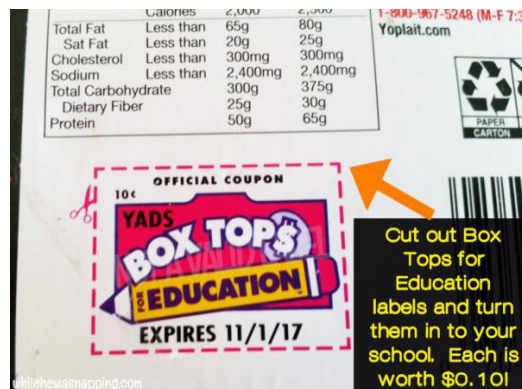
