You can sign up online, or sign up in person at any of the 54 neighborhood libraries around the city. Anyone who lives, works, pays taxes, or attends school in the city of Philadelphia is eligible for a Free Library card, as is anyone who lives in the state of Pennsylvania.

Free Library card gives you access to thousands of books, DVDs, CDs, and other research materials, as well as access to our collections of downloadable media, online databases, and so much more!

In fact, you can do a few things with a Free Library card that just may surprise you:

- Stream movies, television shows, music, audiobooks, and graphic novels directly to your computer or mobile device using Hoopla
- Read and download your favorite magazines online using Zinio
- Learn a new language (or brush up on an old one) using Mango Languages
- Sign in to Brainfuse to interface with a tutor and get homework help
- Access books and other resources that the Free Library doesn't have, through our Interlibrary Loan program
