



ATTENTION YOUNG IMMIGRANTS IN THE U.S.

A new policy has been announced by the U.S. government which will offer qualified young immigrants deferred action from deportation and make them eligible for work authorization in the U.S.

To be eligible you must:

- Be 15-30 years old
- Have entered before age 16
- Have been present in the U.S. for 5 years as of June 15, 2012
- Have not been convicted of one serious crime or multiple minor crimes
- Be currently enrolled in school, graduated or have a GED, or are honorably discharged veterans of the Coast Guard or Armed Forces of the United States.

Be aware that the specific requirements for filing for these benefits are still being developed by the U.S. Government and will not be finalized for the next several weeks.

Immediately contact the immigration lawyers at Catholic Charities at [\(405\) 523-3001](tel:4055233001) to obtain accurate information about eligibility for and *the limitations* of the new policy and to learn what documentation should be gathered and what other steps should be immediately taken to be prepared to file for these benefits when they become available.

Avoid notarios and unqualified individuals who may charge unconscionable fees or make promises which they cannot keep in regards to this new policy!
