BECOMING PROVIDERS

The Israelites were out in the desert, and they began to suffer from hunger. So great was their hunger that they longed for the 'good old days' of slavery in Egypt, when at least they had their fill of bread. What they did not know was that soon they would be eating "the bread of the mighty."

All of us are in a desert, so to speak, suffering from spiritual hunger. So great is this hunger that we long for the 'good old days' of innocence, when life seemed simple and all our needs were satisfied. Jesus comes to us in this desert and gives us "the bread of life" so that we shall never be hungry again.

The readings from Exodus and John are about justice and holiness: providing all the people with our daily bread, and satisfying our spiritual hunger with "the food that remains unto life eternal." The Church puts these readings together in this Mass to suggest to us that there is a connection between the 'justice' issue of hunger and the 'holiness' issue of the Eucharist. The work of God is to feed, and if we want to join in that work, we must become providers, doing all we can to see that no one goes hungry and to bring people to the Eucharistic table of the Lord.

Many persons today are physically hungry. Certainly the solution to starvation and malnutrition requires increased production and improved distribution of food. But it also requires a concerted act of solidarity by the nations and peoples of the world. Our sharing in the Eucharist inspires us to such solidarity, as well as to actions which express it; for sincere celebration of the Eucharist must lead to various works of charity and mutual help.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTOR *Fr. Jeffrey Maassen*

Dear Mystical Body of Christ,

In the first letter of John (1 John 3:18), we hear, "Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed in truth." It's easy to say *I love God*. However, to say I love God, but not live this love by our deeds in truth rings a little hollow. What does it mean to love in deed and in truth? Basically, to live the faith, to follow the teachings of Christ given to our church and listening to the shepherds Christ has given us. Vatican II's

document, Decree on the Bishops' Pastoral Office in the Church, *Christus Dominus*, talks about the bishop and his role as shepherd. "To them (the faithful) they must expound the mystery of Christ in its entirety. This involves those truths ignorance of which is ignorance of Christ." In Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution of Divine Revelations* it states, "As successors of the Apostles then, Bishops have been entrusted with the task of preserving, explaining, and spreading the word of God of which they are servants." In other words, the Bishop's joy is to preach moral truths whether they conflict with John or Jane's opinion or the opinions of say, the media. It's easy to say, '*I love God*,' but really a lie if we live a life opposed to His teachings given through His church proclaimed through His ordained shepherds. This clearly does not mean the Bishops always live up to the teachings in their own life. I myself fail to live up to Christ's teachings at times. It's easy to say '*I love God*,' but ever so shallow when we choose not to spend time with God on a daily basis...i.e. prayer or striving to grow in an intimate relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Certainly our love for God is shown by our attendance at the Sunday Eucharist.

The requirements for NEW referees for this PAID position are as follows:

- You must be 14 years old by August 1, 2018;

- Bring Cash/Check/Credit Card to purchase referee jersey/pealess whistle and lanyard/data wallet w/pad and red and yellow cards. 3 stripe referee socks will also be available for purchase;
- Receive a score of 92% or above on the 2018 Soccer Official's Test
- Referees 18 years of age must meet additional archdiocesan requirements.

couraged to attend a classroom clinic and on field training. Classroom clinic is required for returning referees that score <92% on the official's test.

Pay ranges from \$15/game for K-2 games to \$30/game for 7th-8th grade games.

**7-Year-old Boy
 Starts
 “Underground
 Railroad’ to Res-
 cue Over 1,000
 Dogs From Kill
 Shelters**



IX - Roman McConn may only be 7 years old, but he has rescued over 1,000 dogs from a fatal end.

The youngster is the mastermind behind Project Freedom Ride, a charity that saves dogs from euthanasia and pairs them with loving families across the country.

Roman and his mother first got the idea for the project after they adopted their own dog in 2015. Troubled by the high rates of euthanasia in Texas, Roman started making videos for shelter dogs as a means of helping them get adopted.

Out of a desire to create a kind of “underground railroad” for pups, they launched Project Freedom Ride in 2016 and completed their first transport mission of 31 dogs from Texas to Washington. Now, the mother-son duo rescues an average of over 50 dogs each month.

The charity is not technically a transportation-based rescue effort – they say that PFR is mostly a community effort that is “connecting unwanted, abandoned dogs (and a few cats) who may otherwise be bound for euthanasia in Texas with families, rescues and Humane Societies in the Pacific Northwest.”

“It makes me feel happy saving all these dogs,” Roman said. “But it doesn’t just make me happy, I’m sure it makes all the dogs happy.”
