

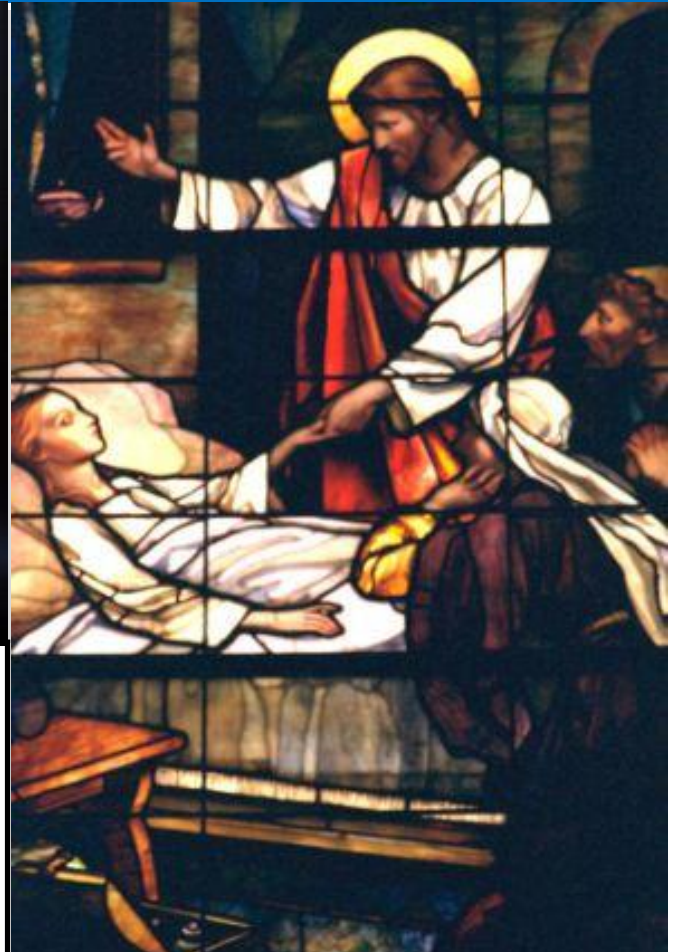

### STATEMENT BY BISHOP ROBERT DEELEY

The executive order approved by President Trump last Friday has left many refugee families in Maine, as well as their family members still seeking entry into the United States, filled with anxiety and fear about what will happen to them. This time of grave difficulty for some of our brothers and sisters calls us to show our concern and solidarity.

As it has for the past 40 years and in keeping with Catholic social teaching, the Diocese of Portland stands behind the Refugee & Immigration Services program of Catholic Charities Maine, which helps individuals and families who flee from violence and come to America seeking compassion, care, stability, and peace. Extending ourselves to refugees is particularly important in Maine, where jobs and opportunities await their presence and contributions.

In this time of uncertainty and division, it is heartwarming to see our young people living their faith by enthusiastically striving to alleviate the suffering of many. For instance, during Catholic Schools Week, the students at St. Thomas School in Sanford will “welcome the stranger” by collecting supplies and donations for refugees receiving assistance from Refugee & Immigration Services. It is one of countless service projects and works of mercy presently on display throughout the state and country, inspiring and courageous efforts that truly define the greatness of our nation and answer our baptismal call to serve the most vulnerable among us, regardless of whether they are born in America or are new arrivals.

Please join me in asking God to protect all refugees in their travels. May they find a loving and welcoming people in our country, and may our kindness and care make us worthy of the refuge we all find in the Lord.

### STATEMENT BY CATHOLIC CHARITIES MAINE

Catholic Charities Maine Stands in Solidarity with Refugees

Portland, ME -- In response to the news circulating about the possibility of significant changes to the Federal Refugee Resettlement Program, Stephen Letourneau, CEO of Catholic Charities Maine (CCM) stated that the Agency remains 100% committed to working with the refugee population here in Maine and providing a complete continuum of services.

“Our hearts go out to refugees, especially our clients here in Maine, and those who are currently awaiting reunification with their families,” said Letourneau. “We stand in solidarity with, and have tremendous compassion for, the plight of refugees worldwide who are fleeing their home countries for fear of persecution because of race, religion, nationality, or political opinion — the freedoms we hold so dear here in the United States,” Letourneau added.

With refugees subject to the highest level of security checks of any traveler to the United States, CCM is hopeful the new administration will recognize that keeping America safe and welcoming refugees are not mutually exclusive.

“Caring for this most vulnerable population is not just our job, but

fulfills our mission guided by Catholic social teaching to work for justice and care for the oppressed. We have a 40-year history of ‘welcoming the stranger’ through our Refugee & Immigration Services program and we fully intend to carry on this proud tradition in partnership with the federal government,” Letourneau added.

### STATEMENT BY UNITED STATES CATHOLIC BISHOPS

President Donald J. Trump issued today an Executive Order addressing the U.S. refugee admissions program and migration to the United States, generally. The executive order virtually shuts down the refugee admissions program for 120 days, reduces the number of refugees to be admitted to the United States this year from 110,000 to 50,000 individuals, and indefinitely suspends the resettlement of Syrian refugees. In addition, it prioritizes religious minorities suffering from religious persecution, thereby deprioritizing all other persons fleeing persecution; calls for a temporary bar on admission to the United States from a number of countries of particular concern (all Muslim majority); and imposes a yet-to-be determined new vetting process for all persons seeking entry to the United States.

Regarding the Executive Order's halt and reduction of admissions, Bishop Joe S. Vásquez of Austin, Texas, chairman of the Committee on Migration, stated:

*"We strongly disagree with the Executive Order's halting refugee admissions. We believe that now more than ever, welcoming newcomers and refugees is an act of love and hope. We will continue to engage the new administration, as we have all administrations for the duration of the current refugee program, now almost forty years. We will work vigorously to ensure that refugees are humanely welcomed in collaboration with Catholic Charities without sacrificing our security or our core values as Americans, and to ensure that families may be reunified with their loved ones."*

Regarding the Executive Order's ban on Syrian refugees, the prioritization of religious minorities suffering from religious persecution, Bishop Vásquez added:

*"The United States has long provided leadership in resettling refugees. We believe in assisting all those who are vulnerable and fleeing persecution, regardless of their religion. This includes Christians, as well as Yazidis and Shia Muslims from Syria, Rohingyas from Burma, and other religious minorities. However, we need to protect all our brothers and sisters of all faiths, including Muslims, who have lost family, home, and country. They are children of God and are entitled to be treated with human dignity. We believe that by helping to resettle the most vulnerable, we are living out our Christian faith as Jesus has challenged us to do."*

Moving forward after the announcement, Bishop Vásquez concluded:

*"Today, more than 65 million people around the world are forcibly displaced from their homes. Given this extraordinary level of suffering, the U.S. Catholic Bishops will redouble their support for, and efforts to protect, all who flee persecution and violence, as just one part of the perennial and global work of the Church in this area of concern."*



## BLESSINGS FOR FEBRUARY



### World Day of Prayer for the Sick and the Celebration of the Anointing of the Sick

The weekend of February 5 is the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. It is always before the Sunday before the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, which is February

11. It is appropriate to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. As is the custom here in the parish, each church will celebrate the Sacrament at one of the weekend Masses: **8:30 at St. Gregory, 9:30 at St. Jude, 10:30 at Holy Martyrs, and 11:00 at Sacred Heart.** If you would like to sign up to be anointed that day, please contact the office at 207-847-6890 or go online to [www.pothe.org](http://www.pothe.org) and fill out the request form. It would be a great day to take an elderly parent, friend in assisted living, or a neighbor who is homebound to Mass for the anointing. Not only does it speak of our care for the sick and lonely but of our obedience to the command by Jesus as faithful Christians.



### Teaching on the Sacrament of the Sick

A sacrament is an outward sign established by Jesus Christ to confer inward grace through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Anointing of the Sick, formerly called Extreme Unction, is for all Catholics as a means to bring both

spiritual and physical strength. These include those who (1) suffer from illnesses, (2) are scheduled for surgery, treatments for disease, or (3) experience a sudden medical crisis. The Anointing of the Sick

is often administered outside of the "Last Rites" and it should not be delayed without good reason. The sacrament is appropriate for the elderly weakened by advanced age or suffering from chronic or long-term illnesses. The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person's condition becomes more serious or relapse occurs after recovery. The person afflicted has no need to explain the reason for presenting themselves. For those who are in the end-of-life stage or Hospice care, family members should contact their parish priest immediately to have their loved one anointed as a priest may not be available on short notice prior to death.



### World Marriage Day / Blessing of Marriages

February 12 is World Marriage Day and as a custom in the parish, we will be blessing all marriages at the conclusion of Mass on that weekend. World Marriage

Day honors husband and wife as head of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice, and joy in daily married life.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE UPCOMING SURVEY

**How was the Disciple Maker Index survey created?** Catholic Leadership Institute gathered 100 bishops, priests, diocesan officials, parish leaders, and authors/thought leaders (Sherry Weddell, Matthew Kelly, etc.) to a 2-day think tank on parish engagement which produced some initial hypothesis. CLI then took a smaller group of the same constituents and crafted the survey. After that, CLI shared the survey with 15 bishops for feedback and edit. This will be the fourth year of the Disciple Maker Index, and more than 15 Dioceses and over 50,000 parishioners have taken part in the survey over the last 3 years.

**What about confidentiality? With whom will the parish's results be shared? How about individual parishioner's responses?** We take confidentiality of the parishioners very seriously. **Catholic Leadership Institute will not share our parish's individual data without our expressed written permission.**

**Who will the email come from? What should parishioners expect in their inboxes?** The survey will be emailed from [DiscipleMakerIndex@measuring-success.com](mailto:DiscipleMakerIndex@measuring-success.com). The cover note will be from the pastor of the parish but parishioners should look for the aforementioned email address in their inboxes.

**What if I don't receive the email to complete the survey?** If the parish has your email address on file and you do not receive the survey, check your spam folder. The survey will be rolled out to parishes over the course of the week of February 6 so check each day that week. If you have not received the email by Saturday, February 11, please complete the survey using the generic link that will be posted on the parish website front page. You may also want to check with the parish to be sure that your current email is on file and accurate.

## The Importance of Catholic Movie Nights

According to Dr. Amanda Drury in her book "Saying is Believing," testimony is an essential practice for Christian spiritual formation, especially for adolescents who are in the process of developing their identity. In other words, sharing with others how you are personally growing in your understanding and relationship with God, as well as hearing from others how they are growing in their understanding and relationship with God, is a necessary component for the formation of one's Christian identity and practice. In fact, a recent poll on Catholic family life shows that less than 20% of Catholic families are sharing faith and praying with one another in the home.

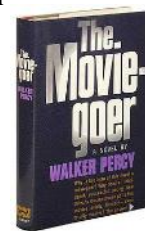

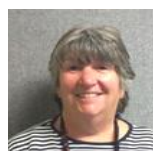
