Fr. Paul R. Marquis will be assist as a as a parochial vicar at the Parish of the Holy Eucharist (Holy Martyrs of North America Church, Falmouth; Sacred Heart Church, Yarmouth; St. Gregory Church, Gray; St. Jude Church, Freeport) beginning February 1. His primary duty will be as hospital chaplain at Mercy Hospital in Portland.

Ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Edward C. O'Leary on August 9, 1986, at Holy Family Parish in Lewiston, Fr. Marquis' first assignment was as temporary administrator of St. Mary Star of the Sea Parish in Stonington and Our Lady of Holy Hope Parish in Castine. In July of 1987, he was appointed parochial vicar at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Madawaska where he served until being named parochial vicar at Holy Cross Parish in Lewiston in 1991. From 1992 to 1997, Fr. Marquis began his service to hospital ministry at the Augusta Mental Health Institute (1992) and Maine Medical Center (1993-1997). In July of 1997, Fr. Marquis was appointed pastor of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Dover-Foxcroft and Holy Family Parish in Sangerville. In October of 1999, in addition to his duties in Dover-Foxcroft, Fr. Marquis was named administrator of St. Francis Parish in Brownville Junction and St. Paul Parish in Milo. In August of 2000, he returned to hospital ministry, serving as chaplain at Eastern Maine Medical Center and St. Joseph Hospital in Bangor. In September of 2002, Fr. Marquis was appointed chaplain at Maine Medical Center. In 2009, in addition to his ministry at Maine Medical Center, he was also assigned as part-time parochial vicar to the Portland Peninsula & Island Parishes. In August of 2013, he was appointed parochial vicar of Corpus Christi Parish in Waterville and hospital chaplain at Maine General Hospital in Augusta. From June of 2015 to July of 2016, Fr. Marquis served as half-time parochial vicar at St. Michael Parish in Augusta and half-time hospital chaplain at Maine General Hospital in Augusta. In July of 2016, he was appointed pastor of St. Peter the Fisherman Parish (Holy Name Church, Machias; Sacred Heart Church, Lubec; St. Michael Church, Cherryfield; service to this parish also includes St. Timothy Church, Campobello, New Brunswick).

Fr. Marquis will be residing at the Rectory at Sacred Heart Church in Yarmout. **Welcome!!!**

It is for those who suffer from illnesses, who are scheduled for surgery, treatments for disease, or who experience a sudden medical crisis. The sacrament is appropriate for the elderly weakened by advanced age or suffering from chronic or long-term illnesses. The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person's condition becomes more serious or relapse occurs after recovery. The person afflicted has no need to explain the reason for presenting themselves. Roman Catholic Diocese of Portland Reissues Flu Prevention

Protocols Bishop Robert P. Deeley has implementing the following directives for all parishes .

- If parishioners are sick or already have any type of cold or flu-like symptoms, they are asked to stay home, both for their well-being and that of others. When individuals are ill, they are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation. Encouraging people who are at risk to stay away from large church gatherings is an extra step intended to maintain their health.
- The distribution of the shared consecrated wine for the faithful is suspended, with the exception of those who must receive from the cup due to medical reasons (i.e., Celiac disease).
- The faithful will be urged, but not required, to receive Holy Communion in the hand rather than on the tongue. All ministers of Holy Communion are advised to distribute the consecrated hosts with care, being cautious not to touch the tongue or the hand of the communicant.
- All ministers of Holy Communion must sanitize their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion.
- Breaking with custom, parishioners should not shake hands during the Sign of Peace and will be encouraged to offer a verbal greeting, smile, or bow of the head. Hospitality ministers should also not shake hands, but rather offer verbal greetings. They will be strongly encouraged to sanitize their hands prior to and after exercising their particular ministry as well.
- Parishioners should not hold hands during the Our Father.
- Sponges, sometimes found in holy water fonts, should not be used.
- Prayers of the Faithful will include prayers for those stricken with the flu or other serious illness, for those who care for the sick, and for the community at large.
