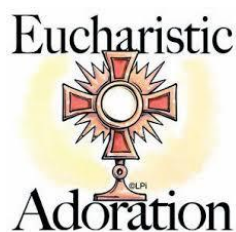

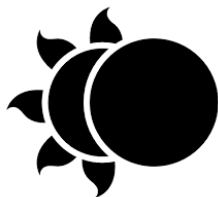
LEGION OF MARY
