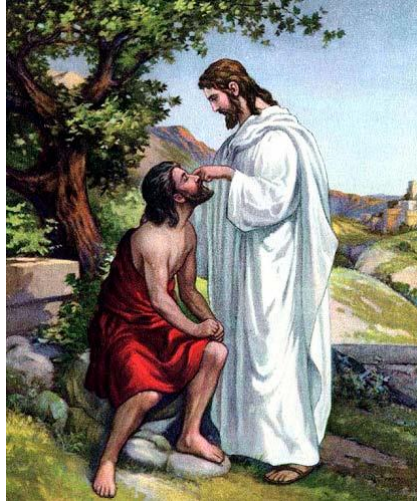

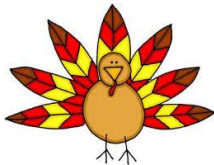

Two significant days are nearing in the life of the church. The first one is **All Saints Day** on **November 1**. This is a **holy day of obligation** in which the Church celebrates the lives of all the saints who now dwell in heaven. The Church rejoices in their witness to the faith and seeks their prayers that all people may join them in the presence of God. **Mass will be celebrated at 8:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.**

The second is **All Souls Day** on **November 2**, in which the Church offers Mass for the repose of the souls in Purgatory. **Mass will be celebrated on Friday, November 2, at 8:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.**

A **plenary indulgence** may be granted for a soul in **Purgatory** if one **visits a church on All Souls' Day and recites the Our Father and the Creed or visits a cemetery and prays for the departed on any day from November 1 to November 8.** The usual conditions for a plenary indulgence apply.



Stations of the Cross will be held **this Friday, November 2, at 5:30 p.m.** By participating in the Stations, one has the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence, assuming all the other requirements are met.
