CCD and **RCIA** classes will resume next **Sunday, January 6, 2019**, at **9:15 a.m.**



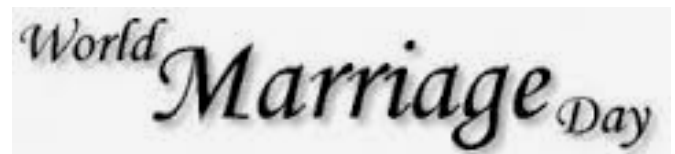

YOUTH GROUP

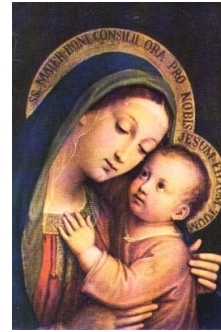

This **Tuesday, January 1**, is not only New Year's Day but also the Octave of Christmas, the **Solemnity of Mary**. For Catholics, this is a **Holy Day of Obligation**. The Mass will be celebrated here at St. John Vianney at **10:30 a.m.**

An Octave is the eighth day of a feast. The Church invites her members to celebrate and reflect upon the significance of the feast of Christmas by celebrating it over an extended period of time. Of course, on the eighth day after birth, Jewish boys were circumcised and given their name. A name signified for the Jews the purpose of a child's life. The name given the son born to Mary is Jesus, which means "the Lord saves". He has been born to bring salvation to all people. Also on this day, we remember the role Mary played in the Incarnation. Her willingness to follow God's will made all this possible. As the Mother of the Savior, she becomes our mother as well when we are united to her Son.
