**DON'T** LOOK FOR THIS TODAY AT MASS –  
"THE ALLELUIA!"

Alleluia is one of two Hebrew words that have endured, untranslated, for uses in our Mass. (The other is the *Amen*.) It is sometimes spelled *Hallelujah* and means "Praise the Lord". This is what we do when we rise to hear the proclamation of the Gospel. Praise is the purest form of prayer because it seeks nothing for itself, but only God's glory. We *ask* God for good things. We *thank* God for graces we have received. Our gratitude, however, moves us to consider not just what God has done for us, *but who God is*. And so we praise the Lord. During Lent the Church omits the *Alleluia*. During this season we cultivate a longing to celebrate the Passover of Jesus Christ, his Paschal Mystery: his Easter. At the Easter Vigil, we restore the *Alleluia*, and the churches ring out with praise at the good news.

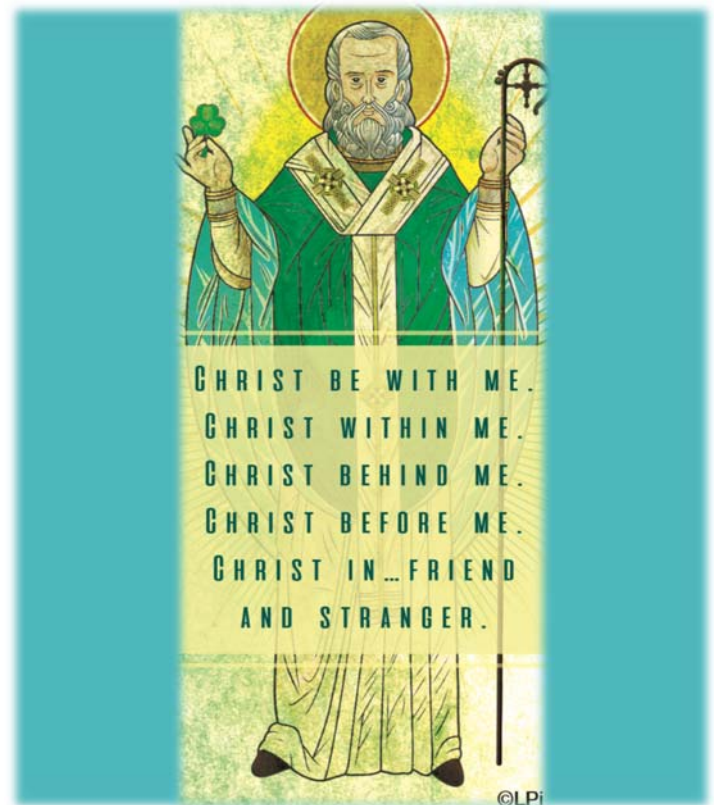
