From the Pastor's Desk



I just thought that since this Sunday we celebrate Mother's Day, it is good to remember our mothers, both living and deceased, in a special way through our prayers and gestures of gratitude and appreciation for all the things they have done for us.

I know Mother's Day can also bring a mix of emotions for some women. There are those anticipating the birth of their first child, step-mothers wondering what their place is, and those who have lost their mother and are faced with grieving on Mother's Day. There are mothers who encounter feelings of hurt because their children have turned away from God, and those overwhelmed with pain from the loss of a child.

We can make them feel better and happy, especially on this Mother's Day, by praying for them, giving our gesture of a hug and saying, "I love you, Mom. Thank you for being my mother". Or you can buy a flower or treat her to lunch or dinner. If I lived close to my mother, that is what I would do. But because I am living far away, I can only pray that God may continue to bless her with good health. I will also try to call her to let her know that I am thinking of her on this Mother's Day.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The **Diocese of Greensburg** has learned of a Caller ID Spoofing scam in at least one of our parishes. People have reported to the parish that they have received a call that shows on their Caller ID as being from the parish. In this particular "spoofing," the caller claims to be selling something on behalf of the parish. A parish does not give its telephone resources and parishioners' phone numbers to an outside sales organization. If you suspect you are the recipient of a "spoofing" call, inform the parish and then contact your telephone service provider for information on how to prevent the scam. Most important, never give personal information over the phone to someone you don't know — especially your Social Security number, bank account number or credit card number. "Spoofing" is one method used to get that personal information for fraudulent use.





In our commitment to follow Jesus Christ we must do more than just show up for Mass on Sunday morning, we must bear Christian witness in all we do – in our homes, in our work and recreation, in our interaction with the world around us, and in the public square.

Any politics of human dignity must seriously address issues of racism, poverty, hunger, employment, education, housing, and health care. Therefore, Catholics should eagerly involve themselves as advocates for the weak and marginalized in all these areas. *But being 'right' in such matters can never excuse a wrong choice regarding direct attacks on innocent human life.* Indeed, the failure to protect and defend life in its most vulnerable stages renders suspect any claims to the 'rightness' of positions in other matters affecting the poorest and least powerful of the human community. If we understand the human person as the 'temple of the Holy Spirit' -- the living house of God -- then these latter issues fall logically into place as the crossbeams and walls of that house. *All direct attacks on innocent human life, such as abortion and euthanasia, strike at the house's foundation.* These directly and immediately violate the human person's most fundamental right – the right to life.
