

Kindergarten Parent Orientation Notes

Curriculum:

The Pflaum Gospel Weeklies are used. There is no text book. Children receive a weekly Promise handout which features the Gospel of the week and a Family Corner feature. See their website, <http://www.pflaumweeklies.com/parents/> for great family activities, posted quarterly that can be used to live out the liturgical year at home.

Flocknote:

Flocknote is an email and text messaging tool created for churches, ministries, teams and other community organizations. You can find us at <https://app.flocknote.com/saintmikes/dashboard>. We have uploaded your primary email. You can add another email to the list (work/home, mom/dad, grandparent). Drop-Off/Pick-Up Procedures:

Parents must accompany their child to their classroom **no earlier than 5 minutes before Mass begins** – Please respect this rule and give the teachers time to prepare for class.

Before class:

- Bring your child into the church
- Select a green “seat saver” from the basket near the entrance to the Church
- Select your family’s seats (sitting in the same place/area each week makes it a bit easier for your child to remember from week to week)
- Place the green “seat saver” on your kindergartener’s seat.
- Bring your child to the bathroom on your way to their classroom – **Parents** must accompany their child to the classroom!

We are required to have TWO adults in the classroom at all times. Therefore, if the parent helper does not show up for their assigned duty, class will have to be canceled! To avoid canceling the class, we ask that you please, stay in the classroom when you drop your child off in class. Please wait until the parent volunteer shows up or someone willing to step in as a volunteer stays.

Children will join Mass around the time of the Prayers of the Faithful. Therefore, parents are required to be in Mass while their child is in class. Look toward the baptismal font to see when the children enter. If your child looks confused, walk around the outside of the Church and collect them. If you sit in the same section each week and bring your child to your seats before dropping them to class, it makes it easier for the children to know where to go.

Attendance:

Regular attendance in the class is beneficial for both your child and the other children in the class. A child who attends only occasionally will not gain much from the program as it is developmental in nature.

Parent Aide:

Every family is required to serve in each of their children's classrooms as a parent aide on a rotating basis. We will email you the link to an online schedule through Sign Up Genius (www.signupgenius.com). Through Sign Up Genius you will receive a reminder and have the ability to swap dates when you have a conflict or a sick child. When you receive the link, please be sure to put those dates in your calendar. ***The ONLY exception is the family of catechists teaching during that class time.***

As previously mentioned, ***if you do not show for your volunteer week, the class will have to be canceled*** unless another parent offers to step in for you.

If you have a conflict it is YOUR responsibility to contact the other families in the class and find a replacement. Request a "swap" via Sign Up Genius and notify the teachers of any last minute changes, so they know who to expect in the classroom. You will be given the parents' names, home phone numbers and email addresses for all of the children in your child's. Be sure to keep it handy in case you wake up to a sick child!

Parent aides are an "extra set of helping hands" for the catechists. Each catechist may have different expectations. *Please ask them what they expect before class begins.* Essentially, you can help by being available for a child who is having a difficult time, escort children to restroom, assisting with craft and activities. The catechist will be responsible for leading the lesson but you can help.

Please don't sit idle, participate! Remember, this is also a way for your child to see that you value faith formation and feel what they are doing at church is important.

Weather Closings:

Check your email or the website www.saint-mikes.org for closing information. Some catechists and families travel a distance to be here and may not be able to get here so checking your email is the best method as an individual catechist may need to cancel even if the program remains open. You should always use your discretion when bad weather occurs. If you are not comfortable driving, do not come but please do notify your child's catechist so they know how many children to expect.

Special Situations:
