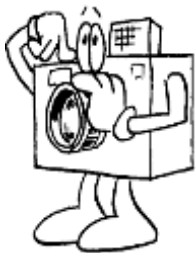
PARISH LOTTERY

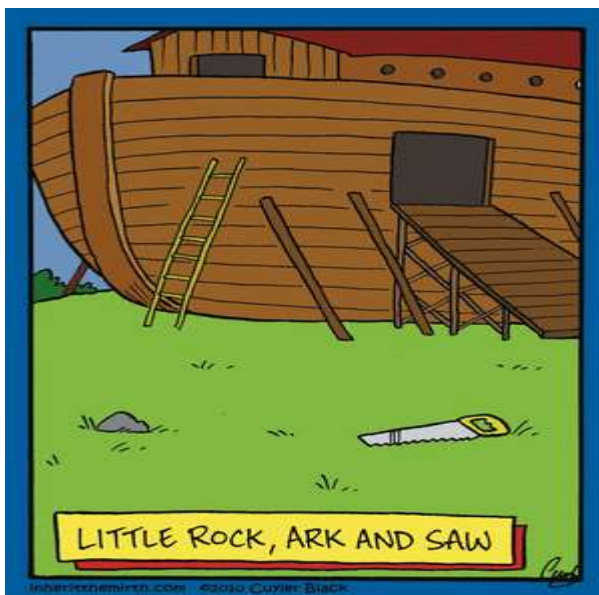
