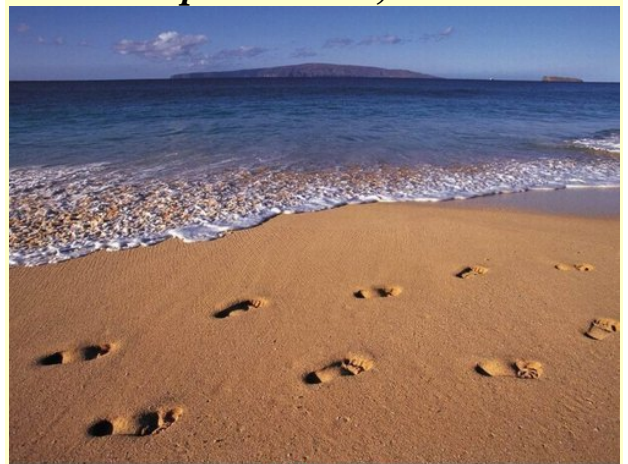

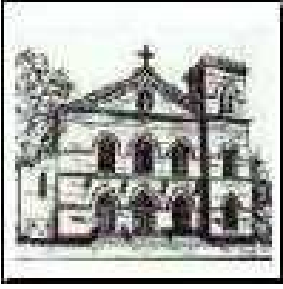

## St. Joseph's Parish Celebrates 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

November 17, 2018

Mass at 5:00 p.m.

The formal beginning of our Parish began with the arrival of Reverend James Dougherty, the first pastor. Just as the history of Kingston is a story of struggle of the people who made up the community, the history of St. Joseph's is also one of struggle. There was opposition from the very beginning within the Kingston community.

Father Dougherty's records indicate that the first collection received support from Catholics as well as Protestants and Jews. \$1,310 was donated by Protestants and Jews making the total collection \$4,175! The second collection netted \$8,043.25 for completion of the church and again many contributions were from people of other faiths.

Many of us today think of ecumenical cooperation as a result of Vatican II and are surprised to learn that it did exist prior to that conference. It was simply community spirit in a free society.
